In February, we were very lucky to have Lee Schofield give a talk about the transformational work he has done on a hill farm in the heart of the Lake District.

From re-wiggling rivers, re-establishing wildflower meadows and re-generating woodlands, Lee and his hard-working team have shown how nature recovery can work hand in hand with local tradition and food production.

It was a fantastic turn out with around forty people and lots of money raised.

This month, members of OWL had the opportunity to visit Naddle Farm for themselves. As well as visiting the Celebration Woodland and hearing a talk about the farm, our group had to the opportunity to view badgers in the new hide.

As dusk fell and the stormy weather continued outside, the group settled in with warm clothes and hot drinks to wait for the badgers to emerge. They took their time, but eventually the group got a really good view of these inquisitive animals, as they came right up to the hide, snuffling under logs and rocks for insects.
